As Deputy Project Director and Facility Manager, Mike Borders is responsible for the safe operations of the Tank Farms, waste and preparation transfers and effluent waste treatment at the Savannah River Site (SRS).

In his role, Mr. Borders has led transformational initiatives, including the combination of three separate facilities, right-sizing and integrating a single management team. He also has led an initiative to consolidate Tank Farm control rooms to reduce operational costs and improve conduct of operations. His team safely transfers over 30 million gallons of highly radioactive waste annually.

Prior to this assignment, Mr. Borders was Program Manager for Savannah River Remediation's American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) work. He was responsible for setting up the ARRA program and for the planning, execution and management of the \$200 million ARRA scope of work.

Mr. Borders has been a Facility/Project Manager for the last nine years and has managed most of the major operational nuclear facilities at SRS. Prior to his recent assignment in the Tank Farms, he was the Facility Manager of H Canyon and HB-Line.

Mr. Borders has over 26 years experience at SRS in the operation, maintenance and engineering of complex nuclear/chemical facilities. Prior to his assignments as a Facility Manager, he held various positions of increasing responsibility, which included Defense Waste Processing Facility (DWPF) Works Engineering, Naval Fuels Engineering and Maintenance, DWPF Start-Up Task Team Leader, DWPF Shift Operations Manager, DWPF Operations Manager, Replacement High Level Waste Evaporator Engineering Mechanical Lead, ITP/ESP Operations Manager and H Tank Farm East Deputy Facility Manager.
